Dear Parents,

Welcome back from Spring Break! What a fast vacation it was—but we are all glad to be back together once again.

A big thank you to all families who came out to enjoy our Math Night festivities at Food Lion last month. We had a blast helping your students have fun while they learned about math in the everyday world. It was so good to see everyone collaboratively working on the tasks—and smiling too! I am so appreciative of the hard work of our staff and the generosity of Food Lion at the Swift Creek shopping center for allowing us to visit their facility.

We have been informed that Swift Creek will be a Title 1 summer school site for this upcoming summer. The dates for the program are July 11th-27th. Susan Rhodes, our former counselor, will be our Summer School Lead once again. She will be responsible for overseeing the program and for recommending teachers for the program. News from Wake County Public Schools

The last District 5 Council meeting for the year was held Tuesday, April 5. Two important items were discussed.

Next Year's Budget

Wake County Public Schools will be submitting their proposed budget for 2016-17 in mid-May. This budget is dependent on the approval of the state budget by the NC legislature. Here are some key items of interest:

- North Carolina is one of only 5 states that is fiscally dependent on federal funding, state funding, and local county appropriation. The majority of our funding comes from the state. Whether this is the final budget depends on whether the state budget is approved on June 30. Nationally, over 90% of Local Board of Education's are fiscally independent.
- Wake County estimates that they will add approximately 2000 additional students this year.
- There will be no increase to teacher pay.
- There will be 5 new schools next year: Beaverdam Elementary, Oakview Elementary, Pleasant Grove Elementary, White Oak Elementary, and Pine Hollow Middle School. In 2010-2011, Wake County had 163 schools. In 2016-17, Wake County will have 176 schools.
- Most of the \$1.5M budget will go towards daily operating expenses and keeping the status quo. Only
 about 10% of the budget goes towards new programs, such as expanding support for the arts in
 middle schools.

Redistricting Wake County

Currently, Swift Creek is in District 5. However, the NC legislature has created new districts for the upcoming November election. As a result, the schools that used to be in District 5 are now spread across three districts. Swift Creek will be in District 6 and still be represented by Dr. Jim Martin (if he is re-elected)

on the school board. However, Dillard Middle School will be in a different district. This means that if you live in District 6, you could be voting for a school board representative who doesn't represent your child's school. For example, when your child moves to Dillard, you won't be able to vote for the school representative in Dillard's district.

If parents are concerned about these changes, Dr. Martin encouraged meeting attendees to contact their Wake County representatives in the NC House and Senate.

Single Subject Acceleration (SSA) is the practice of assigning a student to a higher-grade level than is typical, given the student's age, for the purpose of providing access to appropriately challenging learning opportunities. SSA is an accelerative practice that allows students to show mastery of the content of a course without having taken the course.
