This element of the Other People Matter Mindset (OPM2) means that when I'm with other people, I'm present and give them my full attention.

A deliberate focus on being present is so important today due to the increasing number of distractions vying for our time and attention.

#### What Does Appreciation of Beauty and Excellence Mean?

**Appreciation of Beauty and** You notice and value the world's beauty and people's skills. You don't take things for granted.

#### Why Does It Matter?

Appreciating excellence and beauty helps an individual experience positive emotions and connect to the world around him/her. It's an outward facing strength, meaning the individual is focused on the world outside his/her head. And, not only is the individual outwardly focused, but often deeply absorbed in a sense of awe or admiration, freeing him/her to forget anxieties and troubles.

On a group level, those who appreciate excellence and beauty make our lives more enjoyable. First, it means that they're not looking to criticize the world or its people, but instead take pleasure from their excellence. Second, it is the writers, painters, musicians, and filmmakers who help us better appreciate the world around us. It's due to their admiration for the way the sun hits off a wave or the quiet perseverance of a cross-country runner, that we are able to see the world with fresh eyes.

#### What Does Purpose Mean?

#### Why Does It Matter?

## Early Start Helps Prepare Children for Kindergarten

Dear Families,

Wake County Public Schools is pleased to provide a special learning experience for selected students, prior to the start of their Kindergarten school year. Early Start is a Title I Program designed to help children prepare for Kindergarten. The goal of this program is to create a smooth transition into Kindergarten.

Eligible students will participate in classrooms of no more than 18 students, who are all entering Kindergarten. Classes are taught by certified Wake County Public School teachers. Each class will also have an Instructional Assistant. Students will enjoy typical Kindergarten activities designed to develop social skills and early literacy skills.

You are invited to review the following information and apply for this program.

- Early Start is intended for students with limited or no preschool experience, **are not currently attending a WCPSS school-based preschool program (<u>this is new</u>)**, and who demonstrate the need for supplemental academic support before they enter Kindergarten. School staff will use an approved screening instrument to determine the greatest academic needs. Along with academic need, other weighted factors will also be used to determine program eligibility.
- Parents must bring their child to school for this short screening. Students cannot be determined eligible for the program without this screening.

If you are interested in the Early Start program which will be in session from July 15<sup>th</sup> -July 30<sup>th</sup> at Swift Creek Elementary, please contact your school's Early Start representative, Sharon Hizer, via email at shizer@wcpss.net and she will contact you to set up your child's screening appointment. We look forward to working with you and your child!
