1. Call to Order

- Meeting called to order at 6:32 pm.

2. Approval of January Meeting Minutes

- Motion to approve by Sam Allen.
- Megan Holler seconds the motion.
- January minutes are approved.

3. P2 Budget Vote

- This is the 4th year that Swift Creek has been a part of the Positivity Project. It is still a non-profit. They started charging \$1,450 per year. As of January, they are going to start an incremental increase of the program.
 - 2021-2022 (\$1,995 per year)
 - 2022-2023 (\$2,995 per year)
 - 2023-2024 (\$3,795 per year)
- Is there a reason for the increase in price?
 - Their response was that they needed to increase because they have gotten more schools in the program and their overhead is increasing. They also need to maintain the materials.
- Can we use elements of the program?
 - It is not an option. We cannot wholesale use theirs without paying for the program.
- What exactly do the resources include?
 - We get access to their P2 google drive that has access to readings, books, and materials that go along with the P2 curriculum. It is a lot of PowerPoint slides explaining the character trait.
- Do all the teachers who use it think it is worth the new price tag?
 - We have not had an opportunity to speak with teachers about the price increase.
 - ACTION: Mr. Propst/Chadwick is going to bring this up to the staff.
- Are there any other similar programs that we can substitute P2 for?
 - There were 3 different programs we narrowed down to when we were evaluating different projects. Ultimately we decided to go with P2. We have really positive school data that supports this program and the positive impact it has had on our school.
- From Tina Chadwick: What we discovered through conversations, surveys, and comparisons is that the new price point is lower than many other SEL organizations -- and the facts that P2 is digital and all-inclusive are unique (i.e. no tiered menu of options, such as extra costs for Spanish resources, virtual-friendly activities, P2 for Families). From a sustainability perspective, what also became apparent through this months-long analysis is that our prices were too low to simply maintain the quality of our current resources -- and also continue to innovate and enhance our future resources. Simply stated, if we don't raise prices, we will have a hard time surviving in the future. And, we certainly could not be as responsive to adapting our resources Partner Schools' needs as we are right now.
- Megan Holler: I wonder if we can find out how the other participating WCPSS schools are responding to the increase? Perhaps we can work together to explore other options, if they exist?
- How far out do you have to commit (ie is it an annual renewal?)
 - It's an annual renewal due in April

- Mr. Propst asks that if we decide to go a different route, he would like to know as soon as possible to help decide/create a new plan.
- Alex Dreier shared a resource:

- Annie Pilz mentioned that it is first and foremost for the children and we see the positive impact it has.
- Are students visually benefiting from the program in the same way as children in person?
 - Yes. Students who are virtual are receiving the same material as those in-person.
- Vote on P2 Budget increase of \$245 for next school year
 - Sarah Mailhot motions to approve
 - Maggie Howard seconds the motion
 - P2 Budget has been approved.

4. Recent Spending for New Staff

- At the beginning of the year, we gave classroom teachers a \$125 Amazon gift card.
- We had enough money in the budget (\$250) to give cards to Mrs. Ruiz and Mr. Young.
