From the Principal's Desk

Last Friday, I held our first "Coffee & Conversation" with parents. I was thrilled that so many Swift Creek families were represented, as well as two "future families."


The first question was, "What has changed at SCES since last year?" From my perspective, the school seems to be a much more peaceful, calm learning environment (well, as much as any building with 440 kids in could be!). Staff, parents, and students all seem to be happier. Participation in school events are up, and word of mouth reviews are positive.

I shared with the group that our focus is very narrow: differentiated learning and creating dynamic learning experiences. Our goal is provide instruction to students that meet their strengths and needs and to make the learning engaging.

Test scores last year were indicative of the change and instability of the school for past several years. We project that you will see an increase this year. Mid-year benchmark assessments are in progress now, but we are very hopeful that the data will reveal student growth.

One parent asked about the lack of mention of holidays and cultural traditions at SCES. I believe that it is vital that we integrate holidays, customs, and traditions into our learning experiences. We are blessed with a highly diverse community and elementary school is the place for students to learn to appreciate world cultures. As a result of our conversation this morning, we are going to use our family night during the spring book fair to showcase the cultures represented in our school.

We talked about how Wake County has been very proactive in planning for the changes coming with the K-3 class size mandate. As of now, Swift Creek is in a good position to meet the requirements. Our goal is for this to be the least disruptive as possible. As far as we know, the information that went out last spring about renovations for Swift Creek in the next few years are still on track.

Science Fair is Thursday!

3rd, 4th, and 5th graders! Your Science Fair projects must be in the cafeteria before the 9:15am bell rings.

Here is how our Science Fair is run:

Volunteer judges with STEM backgrounds from the community judge all of our projects (we have both demonstration and experimental project categories). Up to three first - third place and unlimited honorable mention medals can be awarded per grade (depending on our partition numbers). All participants also receive prizes. In addition, the judges pick the three best overall projects. These receive "Best in Show" trophies. "Best in Show" experimental projects are eligible for entry into the regional fair. Swift Creek covers the registration fee for the regional fair and Jen Miller, Science Fair chair, will provide an information sheet to "Best in Show" parents detailing how to register for the regional fair. We also have a recognition ceremony on the evening of the Science Fair where Jen is available to answer any questions parents may have.

Tips from your School Psychologist

Evenings can be crazy with homework, after school and evening activities, and managing tired children after a long school day! It can be difficult ensuring that your children get enough sleep, but sleep is so very important. Studies have found that sleep is key in repairing and healing the body, such as repairing the heart and blood vessels. It is important in helping to increase immune system function so that children can fight off illnesses faster. Adequate sleep is also key to optimal learning and memory function and ensuring that children are ready to learn at school. School aged children need approximately 10 hours a sleep a night. If your child falls asleep within 20 minutes of going to bed, wakes up relatively easily in the morning, and doesn't fall asleep during the day, they are likely getting adequate sleep. Consider the following tips to help your children get enough sleep:

Routine, routine, routine. Set a bedtime routine, and stick with it. It can take up to two weeks in order for a habit or routine to become second nature. An example of a bedtime routine might include: a warning 20 minutes before it is time to begin the routine, putting away all toys or electronics, a bath or shower, brushing teeth, picking out clothes for the next day, and then reading a book with a parent for 15 minutes. Consider using a checklist or chart to encourage older children to do these steps independently.

- Keep in mind that the recommended 10 hours is all sleep time; therefore, a child that is sent to bed at 8p.m. may not actually fall asleep until 9p.m. Begin your bedtime routine with that in mind.
- Keep electronics right before bed to a minimum as studies show that screen time right before bed interferes with being able to fall asleep and getting quality sleep.
- Perhaps an evening activity each day of the week interferes with the evening routine and getting to sleep on time. Children enjoy and need unstructured "down" time at home in the evenings after a long day at school. Although weekends may be a time to relax in the evenings and stay up later, keep in mind that it may be harder to get back in a good routine on Sunday evening and may lead to your child requiring even more sleep to catch up.
- If your child gets the recommended amount of sleep, but is still tired all of the time, bring up this concern with the child's pediatrician for possible further evaluation.

During this performance, students will learn about traditional dance and music of African and African American cultures. Performers will demonstrate and share history of dances and movements, as well as context about certain instruments and how they were made before modern technology.
