## Frequently Asked Questions

#### How do I know if a product qualifies?

#### Can I send my receipt in to my coordinator and have them scan it for me?

## WCPSS Proposed Budget for 2019-20: Notes from BAC District 5 Meeting

These notes are from the Board Advisory Council (BAC) meeting for District 5 on April 23. If you have specific questions about these notes, please contact Marie Dexter (scribe) at mariecdexter@gmail.com.

Recently, Superintendent Moore released the proposed WCPSS Operating Budget for 2019-20. To help community members understand more about the budget details, Dr. Jim Martin had this as the topic of the April 23 Board Advisory Council (District 5) meeting.

The agenda of this meeting was to show where we currently are with Wake County schools and where the needs are. David Meter, the CFO for the Wake County Public School System, and his colleagues from the Finance dept lead the presentation.

Wake County Public Schools has a \$1.7B operating budget. If you include capital, it is a \$2B budget, which is basically the budget of a big business.

Things to note:

- Wake County Schools are legally required to accept EVERY customer in a certain age range (unlike private or charter schools who can select students).
- Wake County does not have a way to re-invest profits for future growth. They are depended on funding.
- In the budget, the amounts listed from the state are what we think we are going to get. These amounts have not been confirmed.
- While student growth has slowed in the county this year, it is not consistent throughout the county. For example, elementary schools lost 1000 students, but middle schools gained 1000 students and high schools grew by 150 students. New schools are still needed because we cannot take elementary school seats and apply them to middle school.
- WCPSS is underfunded \$25M for what we need to maintain our buildings. To add 1 day of custodial cleaning to all schools in the county, costs \$2M.
- To meet the K-3 mandate, which will go into full effect in two years, Wake County needs to hire 300-400 additional teachers. The current staff turnover in a year is 1200-1500. With the requirement of these additional teachers, Wake County will require more teachers than is currently in the pipeline of schools like UNC. Other counties in NC are at risk of losing their teachers to Wake County, which means students in other counties might have long-term subs rather than teachers.
- For student support services (counselors, social workers, and more), the state funds for only 1/2 the nationally recommended amount. Any additional funding is provided by local sources.
- Local funding comes from sales tax and property tax. Soon, Wake County property tax will be 64 cents on \$1. In other counties, Durham, Mecklenburg, Orange, it is 80 cents on the \$1. For every penny (per \$100) that we increase Wake County property tax means \$15M for Wake County public schools. (So a \$100,000 property would see a yearly increase of \$10).
- Charter schools also receive local funding and this funding comes from the Wake County school budget. So if \$5M goes to transportation for Special Education kids or bus repairs, charter schools currently receive 7.9% of this money even though they don't have to provide transportation resources. Next year, this increases to 8.7%. So if Wake County has a \$1M need, they need to ask for \$1,095,290 so \$95K can go to charter schools.

For the past decade, funding for Wake County Public Schools has come from these resources:

• 60% state funding

- 30% local funding
- 10% federal funding

Wake County is one of the wealthiest counties in the state, so it gets less state appropriation than other NC counties. This mean more local funding is required. However, in Wake County, the cost of living is 7% higher than the national average.

Here is are some details from this year's budget:

- \$7M goes to charter schools
- \$4.5M for funding the K-3 class size mandate
- \$2.2M for Employer State Benefit
- \$4.2M for salary increase for certified staff
- \$0.9M for salary increase for non-certified staff
- \$8.2M to operate the 4 new schools that are opening next year (2 Elementary, 1 Middle, 1 High)
- \$2.9M for student growth. The county is predicted to grow by 600 students next year.
- \$2.8M for Special Education needs. A lot of this goes to contracts for transportation costs.
- \$4.2M for Program Continuity and to maintain Extra Duty Schedule.
- \$3.5M for Property Costs. Most of this is for a \$2.5M rate increase from Duke Energy.
- \$8M is to address needs that have been deferred for several years. This allocation puts a dent in those needs but does not fully fund these programs.
  - \$708K for teacher salary supplement schedule
  - \$3.8M Compensation for non-certified staff (nutrition, bus drivers, data manager). This is a 5 year phase in. Currently, these employees make less than the \$15 minimum wage that is required for all state employees who are NOTK-12 employees.
  - \$2.5M for Maintenance and Operations. 5 Year phase in plan.
  - \$600K for instructional support. 5 year phase in plan.
  - \$2.8M for new programs and expanding current programs
    - \$868K requested for an additional Assistant Principal in Elementary schools with over 850 students
    - $\circ$  \$916K for Special Education

#### What You Can Do

So that's ALOT of information. Here are some next steps that you can take.

- Share this information with your family, friends, neighbors
- Contact your state legislature and advocate for the legislative agenda. An additional point of advocacy is Senate Bill 247, which proposes that NC stop opening charter schools until more studies are done about their effectiveness. Another suggestion is to advocate for charter schools to be responsible for advocating for their own funding. Currently, the Wake County Board of Education advocates for both public schools and charter schools, and as stated previously, a portion of this money goes to charter schools, even if the charter school doesn't provide that service (such as transportation). It could be that charter schools must individually request funding to meet their specific needs.
- Go to a School Board meeting and ask for more information about next year's budget
