### **Treasurer's Report**

Kim Partin, PTA Treasurer, presented the update on the budget.

#### For income:

- We recently received \$1200 for Painless Fundraising. The majority of this money came from Box Tops and some from the Harris Teeter VIC program. Currently, the income for Painless Fundraising is \$2000 this year. If anyone has suggestions on how we should spend that money this year, please let us know. In the past, this money has been used to buy PE equipment, guitars for music, and a print machine for art.
- We received another \$1000 in spirit wear sales.

#### For expenses:

- The Science Fair went slightly over budget by \$77.00. Later in the meeting, we will vote to adjust the budget for this additional expense.
- The student directory was released, so slight expense in that category.
- Each grade receives a \$400 grade level grant. The specials (art, music, PE) receive \$200. About half the staff has spent their grade level grant money. The rest of the staff need to do so soon.

Anticipated income for the rest of the year:

- Book Fair sales. This money goes back to the library to buy books for the school.
- Yearbook sales

#### **Update from Healthy Lifestyles Committee – Walking Wednesdays**
