What Does Bravery Mean?

You act with mental, moral, or physical strength even when you know things are difficult or scary.

Why Does It Matter?

Overcoming fears is critically important in individual development, as it allows the person to do more and become more. A person can be brave every single day. On a group level, bravery is inspiring and contagious. Witnessing an individual's brave act – whether a soldier in battle or standing up for a bullied student – is a form of leadership and often encourages others to take action.

Advocacy Update: School Bond on Nov 6 Ballot

As many of you know, Swift Creek is scheduled to get a new building in the next few years. However, because of the recent deficit in funds from the state, this rebuild could be pushed out farther in the future than we hoped.

The Nov 6 ballot includes a Wake County school bond, which will not exceed \$548M. Here is how the money would be used:

- \$140M New schools
- \$283M Renovations
- \$89M Tech, Infrastructure, & Property Management
- \$36M Contingency and Management

Early voting starts Oct 17 and runs through Nov 3. Absentee ballots must be requested by Oct 30.

On Nov 6, polling places will be open from 6:30am – 7:30pm. Wake County Schools are opening on a two-hour delay (which means that at Swift Creek school starts at 11:15am. The carpool line opens at 10:45.).

Watch DOGS

Did you miss the Watch DOGS meeting last month? Watch D.O.G.S. stands for Dads of Great Students. This is a program that focuses on education and safety in schools by using the positive influence of fathers and father- figures for a two-fold purpose:

- 1. To provide positive male role models for the students, demonstrating by their presence that education is important.
- 2. To provide extra sets of eyes and ears to enhance school security and reduce bullying.

Fathers, stepfathers, grandfathers, uncles, older brothers, cousins are asked to spend at least one day at their student's school volunteering. They will support the school through: monitoring the school property, working in small groups, reading, using flashcards, helping with homework, refereeing games, listening ears, or whatever else needs to be done to PLANT SEEDS OF SUCCESS in the lives of the students. They can actively engage with not only their student(s) but the entire student body. All volunteers must be registered with Wake County Public Schools. 

This year ReadVolution runs from Monday, Sept. 24 to Friday, Nov. 16, 2018.

This year's challenge features both individual and school-wide components.

The individual component includes the following:

- Through an online tracking system, students will provide their name and the number of minutes read each day. Please see the log-in instructions.
- Students who achieve the goal of reading **20 minutes per day** throughout the allotted time frame (**for a total of 800 minutes**) will receive two complimentary ticket vouchers to a Hurricanes home game.

The school-wide component of the challenge includes the tracking of books read collectively at the school site.

- Schools that collectively read 2,020 books between Sept. 24 and Nov. 16 will be entered into a
 drawing by region to participate in a culminating event (the Cool School Field Trip) at PNC
 Arena during the school day in February.
- If your school is selected from the drawing to attend the Cool School Field Trip, students will have the opportunity to see a Hurricanes practice, participate in fun activities, and hear from Hurricanes players.
- Students will record the titles of every book they read along with their names on paper "pucks." These "pucks" will be added to their school's Hurricanes hockey goal banner. The goal is to collectively fill the banner with **2,020 pucks**.






