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| Advocacy (Marie) | - Check your sample ballot for school board members running for office during the $11 / 8$ election <br> - There is a school bond being voted on as well. Swift Creek is not directly going to benefit from this bond, but Athens Drive HS likely will. |
| Principal's Report (Propst/Smith) | - Building Community session for Hispanic families, led by Mrs. Morales on 10/27 <br> - December 1st-Literacy Night, in conjunction with the book fair <br> - Each team will present on how families can support literacy at home <br> - EOG Results <br> - Overall, in WCPSS and beyond, EOG scores have trended downward since the pandemic <br> - Our overall proficiency (levels $3,4,5$ ) is $57.7 \%$ <br> - Our scores dipped from the $18 / 19$ scores to the 20/21 scores, which was expected due to the pandemic. The area superintendent hoped schools would gain at least $1 / 2$ that amount back in the $21 / 22$ year. Our school met our pre pandemic scores $100 \%$ in the $21 / 22$ school year, which is fantastic! <br> - Even more good news is that, not only have we met our $18 / 19$ scores, we have met or exceeded GROWTH in all areas. This is not being seen commonly in schools right now. <br> - How did we do this? We were intentional about teaching the standards. We recognize all students come to us at different levels. We are focused on differentiating our core instruction to help students grow. |
