### **Read-A-Book Grant**

Mr. Propst, SCES Principal, introduced Mr. Fletcher representing the Cary Rotary Club.

## Character Education

Mrs. Hoke, SCES Assistant Principal, described a new character education movement for Swift Creek kicked off this week: The Positivity Project

The Positivity Project is a non-profit that partners with schools to teach 24 character strengths. It helps you recognize the good in yourself and in other people. "Other People Matter"

A video was shown about the movement

Next week the school will start going over character strengths

## MTSS (Multi-tiered System of Supports)

Kristin Lewis(SCES school psychologist) explained this system.

It is a data driven process that allows teachers to quickly identify student needs and to respond.

There are 3 tiers for Academics/Behavior:

Tier 1	Core Instruction	80% of students will meet goal with this instruction
Tier 2	Core Instruction + more targeted intervention (teachers create a Tier 2 intervention plan)	
Tier 3	Core Instruction + intensive intervention (parents invited to Tier 3 mtg)	~5% of students

The idea is that a student at Tier 3 will eventually move back to Tier 2 and then Tier 1.

A sample intervention plan was shown.

Mrs. Lewis requested volunteers for the HELPS reading fluency intervention program. Someone will be in touch for those who have signed up.

Marie recorded and will put on the PTA YouTube page. We need parents at tonight's meeting to encourage others to be in school to help.

## **Fun Run**

Kim Partin gave an update about the Swift Creek PTA Fun Run.

The Fun Run has been the primary fundraiser for the PTA for many years.

The theme this year is "Running Through the Decades"

Each grade will make a video about their decade.

Date- Oct. 19, 2017 Rain date- Oct 24, 2017

Goal: \$17,000

Prize structure is being revamped. There will be a Fun Run Prize wagon each week for students who bring in donations.

We are working with The Get Movin' Crew, which provides an online fundraising site and database for schools. Students can create a personal online fundraising page.
