From the Principal's Desk

Dear Parents,

How can it be that we have the first month of school behind us? Time flies when you are having fun around the Creek.

Please mark your calendars for the Swift Creek PTA annual Fun Run on October 6th! There are two rain dates and those are scheduled for October 8th and October 12th. Our PTA team has worked hard to get this event planned and the theme this year is "We're Wild about Swift Creek!" This is the PTA's only fundraiser—and the goal is \$20,000. So far, we have raised \$1,642.00 of the \$20,000! If you are new to the school, the event is a fun, healthy way to raise money for the PTA, and this money in turn goes back to all the students at Swift Creek—for items such as cultural arts, funding for classrooms, Reflections, the Winter and Spring Flings, and the Fifth Grade Celebration. Students gather pledges for laps run and have a blast with their classmates during their time slot running as many laps as they can. (An event schedule for each grade level is included in this newsletter.) If you are able, please consider helping your child with the pledges and collections. This year, every child who raises any money at all will receive a prize and will be entered in the grand prize drawing! This promises to be another exciting event for our students and community and volunteers are still needed, so let PTA know if you can assist.

Schools use a variety of data to measure student progress and inform instruction. You may have seen the recent achievement data that was released by DPI. One type of data from last spring's EOGs includes the proficiency data. Proficiency data is the percent of students who scored proficiently on the tests. These numbers include both the percent of students scoring proficient—3, 4, or 5 and the percent of students scoring proficient and meeting the college and career ready standard—4 or 5.

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Another type of data that the state compiles is the performance of various subgroups against AMO targets, or Annual Measurable Objectives. The state sets these targets for our various subgroups each year in each subject area, and each year the target increases.

 In reading, the Hispanic subgroup, African American subgroup, Total Student subgroup, Economically Disadvantaged subgroup, and Limited English Proficient subgroup did not meet their College and Career Ready targets. A few of these subgroups were very close to their targets.

In math, only the African American and
 Hispanic subgroup did not meet the College and Career ready targets.

Here is a chart that summarizes Swift Creek's College and Career Ready data from the 2014-2015 school year.

This tells us that we need to pay special attention to the type of instruction we are providing to those students to help them be more successful.

A final type of data that was released recently is our growth data, measured by EVAAS. This type of data tells us if students make a year's worth of growth from one school year to the next. Our school's designation this year was "Meets Expected Growth" with an overall composite of -1.24. This was an improvement from last school year, where we were designated as not meeting expected growth.

Our desire is that every student learns, grows in skills and knowledge, and continues to increase in proficiency. This data indicates that we have work to do by helping our students grow in both reading and math. This year, these efforts are a combined approach to ensure that we are "Setting the Standard of Excellence for All."

- We are addressing our effectiveness as educators by focusing on identifying the academic vocabulary that students need to be successful in reading. Our teachers are excited about this journey and spent the last teacher workday collaborating on reviewing standards and choosing the most critical words to teach this year.
- We are continuing to use a push in model with our interventionists and regular education teachers to help students access the Common Core more effectively.
- We are strengthening our PLTs to focus our attention on data, appropriate instruction, and timely interventions.
- We created a master schedule to protect instructional time and maintain our commitment to the recommended allotments for each subject area and have embedded an hour and a half a week for the PLT collaboration.
- In addition, we will be taking a team through the county-wide multi-tiered system of support (MTSS) training this year.

We ask that you continue to partner with us by ensuring that your child does his or her homework and reads nightly. If you have not already, please take a look at the grade level compacts to help you with resources to help your child. We also hope that you will seek to collaborate with the teacher when you have concerns.

If you have further questions about the data or about how we are providing sound instruction for your child, please let us know.

News from Wake County Public Schools: District 5 Council

The first District 5 BAC meeting of 2015 was held Monday, September 14th at Middle Creek High School.

Dr. Jim Martin, WCPSS District 5 Board Member welcomed the principals and parent representatives and shared the primary responsibilities of the Board of Education. The primary responsibilities of the Wake County Board of Education are to establish a vision and set policies for the school system. Wake County Public School System (WCPSS) staff are then tasked to develop rules and procedures which adhere to the established policies. Dr. Martin reminded those in attendance that ANYONE can speak to the School Board. The Wake County School Board meetings are always open to the public and occur usually twice per month. In order to address the School Board, individuals should register in advance and can speak for up to three minutes. Laura Evans, Director for Student Assignment shared with the BAC proposed assignment plans for the 2016-17 school year. Wake County currently has 155,184 enrolled students and anticipates 3,000 more in growth annually. Next year, one new middle and four new elementary schools will open. It appears that Swift Creek Elementary assignments should NOT be affected by these school openings. WCPSS staff has recommended making Athens Drive High School a magnet school. The School Board will consider this recommendation during upcoming meetings. Swift Creek parents should be aware of this possible magnet change since Swift Creek Elementary is one of many schools which "feeds" Athens Drive High School. 
